

New Academic Programs Serve More Students

The first cohort of the Spanish-language AA degree in Theology with a Concentration in Catholic Social Teaching began classes in August, and a second cohort began in late October. This program equips students with an understanding of the teachings of the Church in relation to the common good, the dignity and transcendence of the human person, principles of the moral life, and the relationship between faith and reason. We are grateful to the Lilly Foundation, our supporters, advisors, and faculty members who made this new program a reality.

The new 12-credit Undergraduate Certificate in Catholic Social Teaching, taught completely in Spanish, is now enrolling students. Students will learn the principles of Catholic social teaching, study its biblical and magisterial sources, and become familiar with the See, Judge, Act methodology that the Church uses in different pastoral settings

The Early College Program, which launched in September, serves qualified high school students who wish to earn college credit. Qualified juniors and seniors are eligible to earn transferable college

credit at a 50% discount. The program is especially attractive to Catholic homeschool families seeking to enroll their teens at a Newman Guide institution.

CDU recently updated its partnership agreement with the Angelicum Academy, which runs an online Great Books program for high school students. Now, juniors and seniors from the Angelicum Academy can transfer 30 credits earned from the Academy to CDU's online AA degree program and complete the remaining 30 CDU credits needed for their AA degree at a 50% discount. Up to 30 additional credits may be transferred by Angelicum Academy Great Books Program students wishing to pursue an online BA degree with CDU, leaving only 30 more credits needed for their BA degree.

This program offers high school juniors and seniors the opportunity to earn a fully accredited degree from a respected Catholic university at a significant discount - and the credits count twice, toward high school and college! In the words of TAA President Pat Carmack, "We believe this will prove to be a huge development in Catholic education in the U.S.'

Dr. Elizabeth Shaw Speaks at Colloquium




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Interim Provost Dr. Elizabeth Shaw is an Associated Scholar of the Hildebrand Project (https:// hildebrandproject.org/), which promotes the thought of Christian personalist Dietrich von Hildebrand. Dr. Shaw gave a response to a paper presented at a colloquium on the philosophy of

Dietrich's wife and fellow philosopher, Alice von Hildebrand, November 2–4, at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota.

Dr. Shaw discussed Alice von Hildebrand's philosophical and other scholarly work in honor of the 100th anniversary of her birth and the first anniversary of her death. The purpose of the colloquium is to expose Hildebrand's philosophy to a wider audience, bring people together for a convivial discussion of philosophical themes found both in Hildebrand and the perennial philosophy of which she is a part, and build community among scholars interested in the realist and personalist traditions in philosophy, theology, political thought, and the arts.

Father Bevil Bramwell Publishes New Book



Professor Rev. Bevil Bramwell's new book, Handbook for Catholic Religious, will be published by En Route Books and Media later this year. A problem for Religious in the 21st century is that they are trying to pray, live, and work in an age that is antagonistic to such a life. In this book, Father Bramwell addresses the existential challenges that face serious Religious every day.

Professor Honored as Eucharistic Fellow in **Crucial Year of Eucharistic Revival**



Theology Professor **David Bonagura, Jr.**, was named a 2023–2024 Cardinal Newman Society Research Fellow for Eucharistic Education. His fellowship focuses on the importance of teaching the Eucharist within all levels of Catholic education and integrating that teaching across the curriculum. CDU is recognized in the Society's Newman Guide for faithful Catholic education.

Professor Bonagura has three master's degrees in religious studies, adolescence education, and the classics, and is a regular contributor to The Catholic Thing. He is the author of Steadfast in Faith (Cluny Media,

LLC, 2019) and Staying with the Catholic Church (Sceptor Press, 2021), and translator of Jerome's Tears: Letters to Friends in Mourning (Sophia Institute Press, 2023). He also serves as religion editor of The University Bookman.

The Library is now operating in both English and Spanish. Students and faculty can access e-books and e-journals from Digitalia Hispánica, a multidisciplinary database that features over 50,000 full text titles from 400 Latin American and Spanish publishers.

Library Director Stephanie Garrett is currently serving as the Faculty Advisor to Student Life. Under her direction, the weekly Student Life Office Hour hosts a speaker series featuring a faculty member presenting on a topic of his or

her choice. Professor David Bonagura was the inaugural speaker, presenting on "The Logos: The Center of Benedict XVI's Theology." The Student Life Office Hour will host one Discussion Night each term. Discussion Nights are open to CDU students, faculty, staff, and alumni.

CDU's social initiative in prison education continues to bear fruit. Our digital prison ministry has served more than 1,771,444 free lessons since launching 5 years ago and 659,000 lessons in the last year. Our 79 courses, available in English and Spanish, are accessible in 377 prisons. For our brothers and sisters who prefer, we have added 60 daily miracles audio files from the Hallow app. The innovative Gatekeepers reentry program on the digital prison platform is achieving phenomenal success. Our prison ministry continues

to blossom with new students, new partners, and new supporters. CDU is especially grateful for our partnership with the Order of Malta Federal Association, which awarded CDU a 2024 grant that will financially support our digital prison ministry production, and whose prison ministry team advises and supports content and the pen pal program. Not all prisons offer digital education opportunities, so we are updating our correspondence program to serve more than eight courses per week.
